- Thyroid-stimulating hormone that screens for thyroid disorders, which can affect energy levels, weight and mood;
- HgbA1C that provides an average blood sugar level over the past 2-3 months, aiding in diabetes detection and management;
- Vitamin D level that helps identify deficiencies that can impact bone health, immune function and mood; and
- Prostate test that monitors potential signs of prostate issues in men.

"These low-cost labs are an excellent opportunity for individuals to take charge of their health, detect potential issues early and make informed decisions with their healthcare providers," said hospitals leaders, adding that the screenings "are a great resource for those who may not have regular access to healthcare or simply want to keep a closer eye on their wellness."
