Belonging at Work: How Loretto Hospital Builds Trust, Recognition and Community

Loretto Hospital's Joy at Work initiative is designed to deepen connection, purpose and safety across the organization. Rooted in direct employee feedback, the program identified key drivers of engagement and introduced relationship-centered strategies,

from peer recognition and support to physical and psychological safety in the workplace. This session will spotlight survey design that uncovers what truly matters to staff, visibility and trust in leadership, and engagement efforts that support well-being and foster a strong sense of community. Fixing the Bottleneck: Tactics for Safe and Effective Care of Psychiatric Patients

The model uses a multidisciplinary approach with dedicated psychiatric triage teams, real-time risk assessment tools, and tailored care pathways to achieve timely and effective psychiatric interventions.

She's also the former political director at ABC News. Walter was an inaugural fellow at the Institute of Politics at the University of Chicago and currently sits on the Institute's Board of Advisors.

Justin Wren, Humanitarian, Author, MMA Fighter, Mental Health Advocate, Podcast Host

After battling depression, suicide and drug addiction, Wren experienced a life-changing journey living with the Mbuti Pygmy people of the Congo Basin rainforest. When he returned, he founded the nonprofit Fight for the Forgotten to knockout the world water crisis, which today has expanded its impact to serve the Batwa Pygmies of Uganda. Called "The Big Pygmy," Wren is a 10-time State Champion, five-time All-American, and two-time National Champion Wrestler. He is a veteran of the Ultimate Fighting Championship and has been inducted into the Black Belt Magazine Hall of Fame. Wren has inspired millions through his appearances on the Joe Rogan Experience, Mike Tyson's HotBoxin', the Ed Mylett Show, ESPN, NBC, CBS, ABC and FOX, as well as being featured in Sports Illustrated and TEDx Talks. He authored the bestselling book Fight for the Forgotten, is the host of his own inspirational podcast, Overcome with Justin Wren, and is a globally recognized keynote speaker. Wren has a deep-seated belief and ability to empower people to stoke the fire that is within us all.

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
